Suite 404, Peoria, Illinois, May 25, 2007, a Heart of Peoria Commission Meeting was held this date at 8:12 AM, at City Hall, 419 Fulton Street, with Chairperson Washkuhn presiding.

ATTENDANCE

The following Heart of Peoria Commissioners were physically present: Washkuhn, Akeson, Biggins, Richey, Schwebel, Smith (arrived at 8:05 AM), Summers (arrived at 8:10 AM) - 7; Absent: Bixby, Lawrence, Sullivan, Williams – 4.

MINUTES

After clarification that late arrivals are recorded in parentheses immediately following the Commissioner who arrived late, the following motion was made:

Commissioner Schwebel motioned for approval of the minutes of the Heart of Peoria Commission Special Meeting held on May 11, 2007; seconded by Commissioner Richey.

Approved by viva voce vote.

PETITIONS, REMONSTRANCES, AND COMMUNICATIONS - CITY OF PEORIA

Chairperson Washkuhn announced Agenda Item No. 3.

REVIEW, DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION WITH RESPECT TO MEMORANDUM TO COUNCIL FOR JUNE 5, 2007, CONSIDERATION, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO: PAST, PRESENT AND POSSIBLE FUTURE OF THE HEART OF PEORIA COMMISSION; PENDING POTENTIAL UPSTREAM APPOINTMENTS TO VARIOUS OTHER CITY COMMISSIONS; TRANSITIONING; FUTURE ROLE(S), FORM AND ACTIVITIES OF THE HEART OF PEORIA COMMISSION AND RELATED MATTERS.

Pat Landes, Director, City of Peoria, Planning and Growth Management Department, distributed a draft of the City Council Communication from the Mayor's Office regarding: 1) Adopting an Ordinance to expand the Planning Commission by four positions; 2) Adopting an Ordinance to change the status of the Heart of Peoria Commission; and 3) Transferring Heart of Peoria Commissioners by appointment to existing planning and/or regulatory commissions.

Commissioner Akeson presented a handout listing possible options for reconstituting the Heart of Peoria Commission in response to the Mayor's memo. She explained the options: 1) Establish HOP/C as a 501 c 3 not-for-profit similar to Peoria City Beautiful; 2) Apply to become a local sub-chapter of the Illinois Chapter of the Congress for the New Urbanism; and 3) Remain unchanged, rewrite the HOP/C Ordinance, and ask to have the appropriate staff support.

Director Landes discussed the high points of the Mayor's memo, which included the need to provide greater focus and maximize resources for implementation of the Heart of Peoria Plan and the need to merge New Urbanism interests with traditional planning organizational structure. She commented on the impact that the Land Development Code would have on private and public developments, with the Comprehensive Plan being the foundation. She

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informed Commissioners that once any commission is repealed, it would be up to that group if they wish to have a private status.

Chairperson Washkuhn indicated he did not think Commissioners have a problem with the expansion. He said there is concern about the Commission's going to a private status and the timing of the repealing because they think they are on the threshold of educating and promoting being even more important when the LDC is approved.

A lengthy discussion followed with Commissioners stating their desire to continue as a City Commission. They spoke regarding the importance of continuing to promote New Urbanism throughout Peoria.

Director Landes informed Commissioners if they want to continue as a City Commission, they need a well-defined function.

Commissioners agreed that more than ever their background and understanding of New Urbanism would be needed in the area of educating the new Form District Code.

Director Landes stated that the budget was not the driving factor in the decision to repeal the Commission, but it was a contributing factor. The Ad Hoc Committee on Commissions report indicated that the Staff costs associated with HOP/C totaled \$115,902 for one year. She asked, "If you continue, what are you going to do?" Commissioners responded that they could supply a lot of help in promoting New Urbanism "to fix the 8,000 acres" and promote the community's quality of life, making the community balanced and accessible.

Chairperson Washkuhn stated, "Best that we are out there advocating at commencement. All that has been accomplished and what will be...It's the education and marketing to the community citizens that New Urbanism is here, and I think the City has to commit to that and fund that."

After more discussion, the following motion was made.

Commissioner Richey motioned that the Heart of Peoria Commission recommends the approval of upstream appointments to the various commissions as outlined; seconded by Commissioner Summers.

There was discussion regarding the need for a Work Plan, along with proposed changes to the Ordinance.

After more discussion, the motion was approved by viva voce vote.

Chairperson Washkuhn called for a brief recess at 9:20 AM and called the meeting back to order at 9:25 AM.

Commissioners emphasized their importance in promoting New Urbanism, i.e., awareness, advocacy, education, and implementation assistance.

Commissioners discussed the differences in private versus public. Under "Public" they listed validity, open meetings act, higher profile, competitiveness, and vital connection to the City elected officials and the organization. Under "Private" they listed no resources (minutes, etc.), no attendance policy, private discussions, solution dollars, and risk of influence from donations.

After more discussion, the following motion was made:

Commissioner Richey motioned to maintain the commission status based on the Heart of Peoria Commission's Mission Statement, Vision, and Core Beliefs, which are attached; and that the Commission develop a Work Plan to complete the work with the Planning and Growth Management Department to achieve those goals; seconded by Commissioner Schwebel.

Director Landes suggested an amendment to add a deadline to the completion of the Work Plan.

Commissioner Richey amended his motion to read: Motion to maintain the commission status based on the Heart of Peoria Commission's Mission Statement, Vision, and Core Beliefs, which are attached; and that the Commission develop a Work Plan by July 30, 2007, to complete the work with the Planning and Growth Management Department to achieve those goals; seconded by Commissioner Schwebel.

Commissioner Smith suggested that in addition to the motion, the Commission submit some type of narrative to show how the Commission adds value

Chairperson Washkuhn called for the vote.

Approved by viva voce vote.

Director Landes indicated she would prepare a memo to the City Council regarding the Commission's recommendation.

Chairperson Washkuhn said he would send Director Landes additional ideas to include in the communication.

Chairperson Washkuhn announced Agenda Item No. 4.

ITEM NO. 4 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION/RECOMMENDATION TO COUNCIL RE: SEARCH FOR A NEW DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TO GIVE DUE CONSIDERATION TO INSURE CANDIDATES ARE ATTUNED TO AND HAVE EXPERIENCE WITH CONTEXT SENSITIVE STREET DESIGN AND SUPPORT NEW URBANISTIC APPROACHES TO PUBLIC WORKS.

Director Landes indicated the Selection Committee had already been established. Commissioners Richey and Akeson agreed it would be important to have a Heart of Peoria Commissioner on the Selection Committee.

Commissioners agreed to submit questions to be used by the Selection Committee.

After discussion, the following motion was made.

Commissioner Akeson motioned that the Heart of Peoria Commission would like the new Director of Public Works to have experience with Context Sensitive Street Design/Solutions and be someone who is supportive and experienced in stopping sprawl, and reestablishing compact, walkable, and an environmentally sustainable city. The Commission would like to have a member of the Heart of Peoria Commission be part of the Selection Committee, whether or not the Heart of Peoria Commission continues to exist in its current configuration. The Commission would like to recommend the names of outside transportation consultants

and practitioners who could provide valuable advice and direction. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Biggins.

Approved by viva voce vote.

ITEM NO. 5 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION, INCLUDING ESTABLISHMENT OF A TIME FRAME FOR COMPLETION, IF STILL NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE, ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF A WORK PLAN TO SUBMIT TO CITY COUNCIL FOR APPROVAL.

Chairperson Washkuhn announced that this item was discussed earlier in the meeting. (See Agenda Item No. 3).

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no Unfinished Business to come before the Heart of Peoria Commission.

NEW BUSINESS

There was no New Business to come before the Heart of Peoria Commission.

COMMENTS

Director Landes informed Commissioners that the Form District Code takes effect on June 15, 2007.

Director Landes noted the City Council would vote on the Land Development Code on June 12. She said revisions to the Land Development Code would be presented to City Council in mid-October.

Director Landes informed Commissioners that Peter Katz is writing a new book and one of the chapters is to be written by Jeff Ferrell and Mary Madden (Ferrell Madden Associates who wrote the Land Development Code for Peoria). Commissioner Akeson noted that Peter Katz was the original founder of the Congress for the New Urbanism and its first president.

Commissioner Akeson informed Commissioners of a traffic forum to be held at Bradley University regarding the conversion of Main Street. Denise Molina, WCBU, added that she thought the forum would be at 6:00 PM in the Student Center.

Director Landes announced the next Comprehensive Plan Workshop would be on Public Safety and would be held May 31, 2007.

General Parker, PO Box 3026, Peoria, IL 61612, questioned why the Heart of Peoria Commission was established initially. He asked for information regarding boundaries, history, and main accomplishments of the Commission.

Chairperson Washkuhn referred him to the City Clerk for a copy of the Commission's Ordinance and a map of the Heart of Peoria Plan boundaries. He mentioned the Commission's input on public projects and the Commission's being instrumental in advocacy of the Form District Code and Land Development Code and promoting the concepts of New Urbanism to the public.

Mr. Parker asked, "Why would the City Council want to do away with the HOP/C? Why together without authority?"

Chairperson Washkuhn indicated there is authority, but no process. Commissioner Akeson stated there is resistance from developers.

Commissioner Summers commented it is not that the City Council wants to dissolve the HOP/C, but rather they are talking about whether private or public would be more effective.

Mr. Parker asked the purpose of the HOP/C. Chairperson Washkuhn responded, "If they pass the LDC, then enforcement becomes the job of the Planning and Growth Management Department. The Commission would continue seeing that it (LDC) is implemented and fine tuned and see if and where it works."

The next regularly scheduled Heart of Peoria Commission Meeting is Friday, June 22, 2007, at 8:00 AM at City Hall, 419 Fulton Street, Suite 404.
